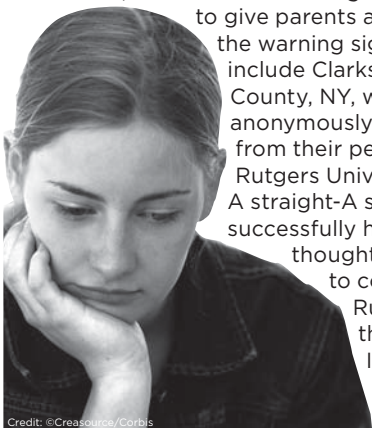

Cry for Help

On **Wednesday, May 6 at 10 p.m.**, a new documentary addresses the critical issues surrounding teen depression and suicide, exploring treatments, mental health testing and community healing programs to give parents and educators a basis for recognizing the warning signs of teens in trouble. Profiles include Clarkstown North High School in Rockland County, NY, where an online community lets teens anonymously air their problems and seek support from their peers and professionals; and former Rutgers University student Stacy Hollingsworth. A straight-A student and gifted musician, Stacy successfully hid her depression and suicidal thoughts until she made the difficult transition to college, where she ultimately founded Rutgers' first on-campus chapter of the National Alliance for the Mentally Ill. Expert interviews include Dr. Chris Lucas, professor of Child & Adolescent Psychiatry at New York University.

Elephant in Zambia, above Victoria Falls

NATURE "Victoria Falls"

Cutting across the Zambezi River, bridging the countries of Zambia and Zimbabwe, Victoria Falls divides two natural worlds — the tranquil river above and the raging gorge below. **Wednesday, May 20 at 8 p.m.**, *NATURE* delves into this place of epic proportions to tell the story of the largest waterfall in the world. The upper river is idyllic, running shallow through sandstone hills and meandering around islands and reed-beds, where elephants, lions, hippos, crocodiles, buffalo, zebra, antelope and otters thrive. But, in a single vertical drop, the river plummets twice the height of Niagara Falls into the wild waters of the narrow gorge, where 35 raptor species rear their young. Between the two worlds, the cliffs and rocky outcrops are covered in a thick rainforest, home to baboons, monkeys, mongoose and parrots.

This month, thousands of swing dance enthusiasts converge on New York City for Frankie95 to celebrate the 95th birthday of one of the great dancers and characters in New York City history. On **Thursday, May 28 at 10:30 p.m.**, WLIW21 shares Frankie Manning's incredible story. From his start in the 1930s as a teenager dancing in the best venues in Harlem to his world travels with Whitey's Lindy Hoppers, Frankie danced with the likes of Duke Ellington and Ella Fitzgerald, and his famous swing number in 1941's *Hellzapoppin'*, still thrills on YouTube. His 1980s resurgence included Tony Award-winning choreography for *Black and Blue*, and today Frankie continues to teach the Lindy around the world.

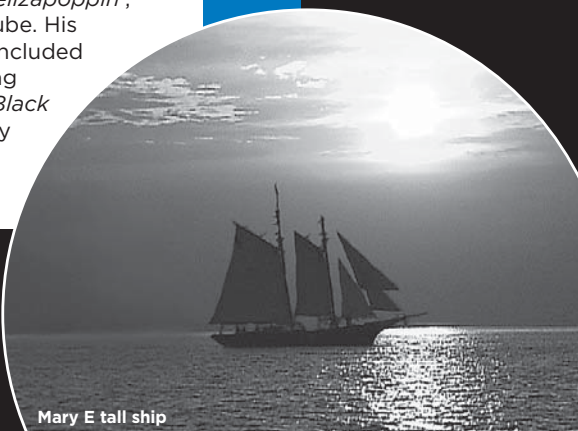

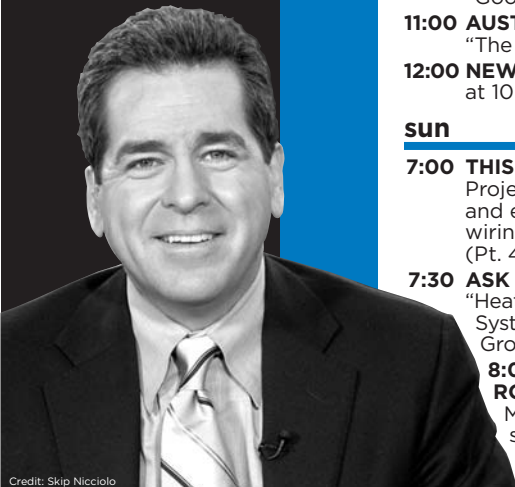
